
As you embark on your future, what personal finance knowledge or practices do you believe will be critical in reaching your collegiate and career goals?



PROVIDING RESOURCES AND EDUCATION FOR STUDENTS

SCHOOLS PROGRAM

The financial well-being of young people is critical to the future success of our communities. Delta Community has taken on the mission of equipping our youth with good money management skills and habits with designated youth financial education through our comprehensive Schools Program, which provides engaging curriculum, events, and resources for elementary, middle, and high school students. Last year, our Schools Program collaborated with 50 schools and community organizations to deliver 42 virtual and in-person workshops to nearly 1,500 youth.

Youth Essay Contest



After a two-year hiatus due to COVID-19 protocols, Delta Community celebrated Credit Union National Association (CUNA) Youth Savings Month in April with an essay contest for our partner elementary schools. Twenty-one winners were awarded \$100 Youth Savings Accounts for their essays that illustrated how well financial education resonates with even the youngest students. CUNA's 2022 Youth Savings Month slogan was "Save Small. Dream Big." Our essay contest asked students at eight of our partner schools to describe what they would save for in their wildest dreams. Participating educators and several parents said our contest inspired great conversations about saving.


SCHOOLS PROGRAM

We invest in the financial futures of students by providing free financial literacy courses, hosting Teens & Money Nights and helping students open Youth Savings Accounts. Delta Community also supports STEAM/STEM initiatives of local schools by investing in STEM labs, maker spaces, community gardens and robotics clubs. 
Social Media Spotlight:

Douglas County's Alexander High School, ALX Robotics Program





The ALX Robotics Team, thanked Delta Community Credit Union for its generous donation of \$1,500, which allowed them to purchase equipment such as motors, encoders, circuitry and pneumatic cylinders for their competition robot. ALX Robotics competed in two state qualifiers where they advanced to the quarterfinals in both competitions. ALX Robotics won the Quality Award handed out to only one robot in back-to-back competitions. They competed in the Peachtree State Championship, ranking 12th among the top 32 teams in the state and served as captain of the 7th Alliance in the playoffs.


